METHOD OF OPERATION

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The affairs of the Foundation are managed by a Board of Directors composed of experienced, reputable individuals from many walks of life with broad geographic coverage. The Directors represent a wide range of numismatic interests and some have been drawn from outside numismatics. In addition, the President of the Canadian Paper Money Society and the President of the Royal Canadian Numismatic Association are appointed ex-officio Directors each year to permit direct liaison with those national bodies.

In order to undertake the work of the Foundation, special committees are established as required, in addition to the Foundation's standing committees.

REQUESTS FOR GRANTS AND AWARDS

Applications for funds from the Foundation may be made by writing to the Secretary requesting an "Application for Funds" form, which outlines requirements for a proposal to support the request.

The Board has appointed a Grants and Awards Committee that reviews and makes recommendations on all requests for funds.

STRATEGIC PRESERVATION OF CAPITAL

Most of the Foundation's objectives are enabled through donations that are held in perpetuity; only the investment income is expended. Individual donors may, of course, determine the basis for their donation. Strict investment criteria controlled within precise by-laws, combined with professional advice, ensure maximum return on all investments.


The Foundation to date has made numerous and diverse grants and awards


- to assist in the publication of a number of major numismatic books which might not otherwise have been published because of the costs involved;

THE FOUNDATION

The J. Douglas Ferguson Historical Research Foundation, established in 1971, is a non-profit educational organization. It fills a need in Canada for financing research and study, and for providing funds for publishing and related activities in the numismatic field.

The Foundation's prime objective is to give financial support to a broad range of activities aimed at preserving our heritage as it relates to early historical currency, banks and other issuers of money, coins, tokens, medals and paper money issued throughout Canada.
